Hearing The Voice of God I Corinthians 14.1-40

This passage is primarily about spiritual gifts—not our SS topic

- 1. God gives a variety of spiritual gifts, I Corinthians 12
- 2. No gift is superior to love, I Cor. 12-13
- 3. Tongues are not the "superior" gift, I Cor. 14

- 4. We believe the sign gifts have ended
- 5. Even if we are wrong about that, the sign gifts are governed by the passage
- 6. This is why this passage is helpful to us
- 7. It gives us God's thinking about speaking authoritatively, apart from the Bible

I Cor. 14.1-25 elevates the gift of prophecy

- •Prophecy is speaking on God's behalf.
- •It may be something future, or something already spoken

- Prophecy is superior to tongues because it builds the Church
- 1. Tongues are not understood by others: 14.2, 14.8-11
- 2. Prophecy builds others: 14.3, 4, 5, 6, 9, 12, 14-17, 19
- 3. The ability to understand is essential to edification
- 4. This is a testimony to the presence of God among us. 21-25

Here's a principle

 Nothing that God ever tells us to do personally should ever be treated as some sort of spiritual status symbol; a reflection of our heightened spiritual condition

I Cor. 14.26-40 Regulates the use of gifts

- •14.25—what the Church did look like
- •14.26; 40—what the Church should look like
- 14.26 All must be done to edifying
- 14.40 All must be done in an orderly fashion: in an appropriate arrangement

And so...

- •2 or 3 may speak in sequence, 14.27; 29, 30, 31
- •What they say must be interpreted or judged, 14.28, 29
- •What they say must be in line with what God has already said, and what one says must be consistent with what others say, 14.32-33, 36-37

Here's another principle

- •God will never instruct anyone to disobey or contradict Scripture
- •He will never instruct anyone to take vengeance, get a divorce, commit murder, lie, hate, or violate, in principle, His teaching

Back to "decently and in order"

- •Women may not participate, 14.33-35
- •Why?
- •They don't wield authority: 14.34; Genesis 3.16
- •This is a restriction from participating in deciding what is or isn't authoritative.

•Women may pray and prophecy, I Cor. 11.5

This provides another principle

- •Not only will God never tell us to disobey "directly"
- •He will never permit us to disobey in order to obey: 2Ti 2:5 And if a man also strive for masteries, yet is he not crowned, except he strive lawfully.
